## Discover an Unusual Artifact from Early California

Forbestown's YFHA (Yuba Feather Historical Association) and their Museum have the articles of Brother Horace Persons a member of Forbestown Lodge No. 50 during the gold rush era...



In the small California town of Forbestown, located in the mountains of northern gold country, a local museum holds within its collection a silver embroidered Masonic collar, adorned with a square and compass symbol within a winged egg. But this is no ordinary Masonic artifact: It is a ceremonial garment from the Rite of Memphis – a Masonic body rarely encountered throughout the history of California Masonry.

Grand Lodge visited Forbestown during 2014. What a treasure it was to hear the old organ played by the Grand Organist Christopher Putnam! The Yuba Feather Historical Association was honored to have Adam Kendall, collections manager of the Henry W. Coil Museum (http://www.masonicheritage.org/), visit and discuss the Masonic history of Brother Persons' collar.
