Lodge Rooms

Prior to moving into its present hall, Livingston

Lodge No. 658 probably had the smallest Lodge room
in the state, the room being twenty-seven feet, four inches
long by thirteen feet, four-inches wide.

Forest Lodge No. 66, of Allegheny, has a Lodge room whose inside measurement is twenty feet by forty feet.

Volcano Lodge No. 56 has a Lodge room twentytwo feet, six inches wide and thirty-four feet, six inches long.

Confidence Lodge No. 203, of Castroville, has a Lodge room thirty-two feet long and twenty-two feet, three inches wide.

The Lodge room of Homitos Lodge No. 98 is thirty feet long and seventeen and one-half feet wide.

<u>Forbestown Lodge No. 50</u> has a Lodge room forty feet long and eighteen feet, six inches wide.
