Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday of May. It was formerly known as Decoration Day and commemorates all men and women, who have died in military service for the United States. Many people visit cemeteries and memorials on Memorial Day and it is traditionally seen as the start of the summer season.

It is traditional to fly the flag of the United States at half mast from dawn until noon. Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, particularly to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers place an American flag on each grave in national cemeteries. Memorial Day is combined with Jefferson Davis' Birthday in Mississippi.

<u>Memorial Day has become less of an occasion of remembrance.</u> Many people choose to hold picnics, sports events and family gatherings on this weekend. This day is traditionally seen as the start of the summer season for cultural events.

History Corner

A sneak peak! Have you ever seen something like this? This small section of an item from approximately the mid 1800's is in possession of the Yuba Feather Historical Association's Forbestown Museum. It is part the Masonic display they have put together for this year. It is quite the item! It created a flurry of emails trying to figure out just what it represented. It was fun to be a part of the discussion which included the Henry Coil Museum! It's a fun find, beautiful and interesting!

This particular item is part of a collection of personal belongings of Horace T. Persons who affiliated with Forbestown Lodge in September of 1868. He was a doctor and had been a prisoner during the Civil War. The items were donated to the museum some years back and have been waiting for an opportunity to come out of hiding! Come up and see the display! Hopefully you will be able to attend on the 28th of June when we will have the honor of a visit from Most Worshipful John L. Cooper III of Grand Lodge.
