Sometimes we hope to get to go somewhere special. Since I belong to the Masonic Family some of the hidden corners involve a side note of Masonry involvement in the history of the little corner we are visiting. Sometimes there is a bit of research done before the trip. In a hoped for future adventure, it was discovered that there used to be a Masonic, California. Some of you may already know this, some may not. Being still fairly new to the Masonic family, most information is new to me!

Where is Masonic California? It is located near Bodie, California. Masonic, like most little towns in Northern California, was a mining town in the hills of what is now Mono County. It was founded by Masons and "was a religious and orderly place by the standards of mining towns -- there were no brothels."
